**Job Summary:** The Task Force Coordinator IV, under general supervision, provides local oversight and leadership to the fire suppression task force and employees assigned to it for various activities. Assists in interactions with the communities, fire departments, and other response teams, and supports agencies and organizations within the branch and across the State as needed.

## **Essential Duties and Responsibilities**

- Serves as an emergency responder with required qualifications /certifications.
- Delivers capacity building programs to Volunteer Fire Departments (VFDs) and Municipal Fire Departments.
- Works with fire departments and communities on fire-related issues to promote local capacity building and increase capabilities on a local and Statewide level.
- Serves on relevant agency and State teams with related training and preparedness.
- Manages and accounts for assigned credit cards, vehicle log books, daily activity time reports, and any assigned
  equipment in accordance with applicable laws, rules, procedures, and guidelines.
- Complies with loss prevention, environmental health, and safety standards as established by applicable laws and rules.
- Instructor for ICS and IMT courses
