## Good Stewards of the State

The State of Texas has a "Set Aside Program for the Purchase of Goods and Services from People with Disabilities." The law states that we should use the products/service if it meets our needs.

We are required to report the exceptions of when we do not purchase goods or services that are available from persons with disabilities contracts through TIBH, meaning they were purchased from another source. The reports are to help identify how the contracts are not meeting the needs such as higher than market pricing, delivery is longer than competitive products, quality, etc.

However, it gives the disabled person a sense of worth and contribution. The use of these products does help the State by helping those disabled citizens to become tax payers and the more independent they become, the less they depend on the state for support. You should think about TIBH just as you do HUB each time you make a small dollar purchase.
